Actions for Palestine



Tuesday 9 May, 6.30pm

Demonstrate at the first Eurovision semi-final that includes the Israeli entry. Israel out of Eurovision! Assemble at the Old Stone Arch on Wapping (junction with Gower Street L3 4FA. Speakers and music.

Saturday 13 May, 1pm

March and rally for justice for the Palestinians after 75 years of ethnic cleansing. Assemble on the steps of St Luke's 'bombedout' church and march to a rally at Derby Square. This year marks 75 years since Palestine's 'Nakba' (Arabic for 'catastrophe').

In 1948 the Israeli military campaign forced 750,000 Palestinians to leave their homes. Those who remained in Palestine became second-class citizens and remain so to this day.

Amnesty International and other human rights bodies have concluded that Israel's treatment of the Palestinians amounts to the crime of apartheid.

Europe is applying strict sanctions against Russia because of the Ukraine invasion. Yet there are no sanctions against Israel, which enjoys privileged trading status with the EU and Britain – and is even invited to the Eurovision Song Contest!

Since 2005 there have been public campaigns for Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions to isolate Israel and get a fair deal for the Palestinians.

We invite you to join our actions and make it clear that the Palestinians deserve better.
